In 2015, after editing for friends over many years, I completed UC Berkeley Extension's certificate program in editing and hung out my shingle.

I edit on all levels (developmental, copy, and line), and also proofread. My primary, though by no means exclusive, focus is working with fiction/nonfiction (flash forms to book length) and poetry (individual poems to manuscript evaluation and building). As well, I mentor and coach, with an approach both process- and outcome-based.

My individual clients come from diverse backgrounds, and have seen publication through our work together; recently, several have secured agents who are actively shopping their manuscripts. Making sentences sing, paragraphs flow, and pages turn are my goals with every client.

Institutionally, I have served as a consultant for Red Lake Nation College, MN (2019 – 2020), working directly with RLNC students to develop and revise short plays for on-campus performances, and at the Voices of the Earth Festival (hosted by Bemidji State University in Minnesota).
